

## **Saddles For Soldiers Program Costs**

Short Term Program Needs: Since 2010, Saddles for Soldiers has been offering services for free to US Veterans. SFS has immediate needs for equipment such as bareback pads, large stirrups, extra-large helmets, as well as marketing and basic administration costs. Immediate needs also include paid program sessions, sponsorship of clients, costs for horse care and maintenance. Each session breaks down to approximately \$100.00 per client per 1.5 hours of Equine Assisted Activities and Therapies.

Long Term Program Needs: Presently, Saddles for Soldiers meets once every other week; the group attending are veterans from around Los Angeles. We provide a 12-step meeting for the group members who are in recovery and subsequently two hours of EAAT. The group size averages from 4-9 participants. We feel that veterans do not receive enough proper care and we would like expand both the time spent in interventions, and the variety of techniques offered.
